New exhibits this month come from donations by G8BLW as well as from museum stock.

Added to timeline: the 1937 publication by Alan Turing and the 1948 running of the first computer program. Thanks to Marcel van de Gevel for the data.

Added art-190. A 1964 design and constructional details for an audio amplifier based on the ELL80.

Added additional pro-forma entries without images for CV valves from CV1103 to CV1190 that include the CV data-sheets and will be found by search in the friends site and in equivalentents. 69 new entries.
